NEXT BASIC CCH AND CCW CLASS

Our next Basic Carrying Concealed Handgun Class and Advanced Carrying Concealed Weapons class is Saturday, June 6th, 2015 at the J.O. Whittington Firing Range at David Wade Correctional Center, Homer, LA. Either class is still \$62 and to be eligible to go through the Advanced class, one must either be currently in possession of a valid CCH permit or has previously attended one of GETS Carrying Concealed courses. Besides being on the range most of the entire time in the Advanced Class it does require a few more rounds of ammunition than the Basic CCH course. Instead of needing only 72 rounds of ammunition as in the basic CCH class, one will need 250 rounds of ammo to go through the Advanced course. We have noticed that ammunition is beginning to get a lot easier to purchase now; besides, in the Advanced course you shoot our ammo for the first hour.
